

Introducing the ASHRAE Refrigeration Awards: Milton W. Garland Commemorative Refrigeration Award for Project Excellence Refrigeration Comfort Cooling Award for Project Excellence

The Refrigeration Committee of ASHRAE seeks to promote refrigeration education and development at all levels of the society. As a part of these activities, the Committee can recognize and honor two projects annually for excellence. These two awards are the Milton W. Garland Commemorative Refrigeration Award and the Refrigeration Comfort Cooling Award.

The Milton Garland and the Comfort Cooling awards are given to project designers and owners to recognize innovative concepts, incorporation of new technologies, or solutions to complex refrigeration problems. These awards communicate innovative solutions to other ASHRAE members and highlight the technical achievements of ASHRAE members to associated professionals, other societies, and other refrigeration facility owners.

For each winning award the project's designer receives a plaque at ASHRAE's winter meeting. The winning project is described in the printed program along with the names of the awardees. The project's owner is honored with a plaque at a refrigeration program meeting of the local ASHRAE Chapter. And the local Chapter receives a felt patch to go on its award banner. Winning projects are announced in Insights, the ASHRAE Newspaper; and a news release is developed and distributed to the Chapter and award recipients for use in other publications and media. Documentation accompanying the winning projects is also made available to ASHRAE's Journal.

Refrigeration plays a critical role in the health, safety, and comfort of humanity. Sharing inventive solutions and technological developments ensures that the refrigeration field continues to advance in meeting these needs. Participation in these Award competitions brings peer recognition to innovative projects, recognizing the commitment made by owners and the technical proficiency of the project design team.
